Put the right spaces, services, and programs in place to meet the needs of members and clients

1. Assess the building and property

- Evaluate use of space based on current program needs and safety and security
- Conduct Building Condition Assessment to determine Capital requirements (3-10 year plan)
- Evaluate leases to ensure cost coverage and create a central Ottawa community hub
- Assess the impact of rentals on the facility, furniture, costs, etc.
- Ensure the physical space meets the future needs of The Good Companions

- The Property Committee and Board of Directors continues to inform itself of major development to Lebreton Flats and areas around the Centre including the Ottawa Public Library, housing developments and the Slater and Albert Streets realignment
- Rural Ottawa South Support Services has rented an office at The Good Companions to deliver their Friendly Voice program for seniors
- The Centretown Community Health Centre LESA Program will continue to deliver services to seniors at The Good Companions
- Meals on Wheels will continue to be a great partner to The Good Companions and will share space at the Centre.
- The Good Companions has continued to be a champion for its members by working with members and the city to increase OC Transpo Service to the Centre to every fifteen minutes
- The reception area was completely renovated and a 2nd waiting area was created to alleviate congestion
- The city of Ottawa agreed to no parking in front of the Centre on Empress during the winter months

2. Be the model seniors' centre (55+ and adults with physical disabilities) in the city and province

- Ensure recognition city and province-wide of the work, leadership and community impact of the innovative and responsive programming of The Good Companions
- Develop and strengthen alliances with appropriate strategic partners to ensure community impact of our programs
- Take a leadership role in local, regional, provincial committees, partnerships to ensure progressive programs and services
- Heighten awareness of The Good Companions to expand our influence
- Build on our inclusiveness and diversity

- The Good Companions was pleased to host Minister Raymond Cho, Minister for Seniors and Accessibility, Province of Ontario and Deputy Minister Denise Cole Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility, Province of Ontario on two separate visits
- TGC participated in an International Research Project with Carleton University that focused on addressing social isolation for older adults
- TGC's media presence increased throughout the fall season. Media outlets featured ongoing coverage during our discussion with the city of Ottawa to restore OC Transpo service to the Centre. The media highlighted The Good Companions' important role in addressing social isolation for older adults
- TGC was featured in multiple media outlets starting in mid-March and throughout the past few months of the pandemic
- Members were featured on The Daily Goods on CFRA to celebrate Mother's Day
- Carolyn Calder, CSS Coordinator, presented a poster on The Good Companions LGBTQ
 Well-Being Check In program at the Ontario Community Support Association conference
- Laura Ward, Seniors' Centre Without Walls Coordinator, led a workshop at the Older Adult Centres Association of Ontario Conference on the success of the expansion of SCWW
- Nikkie Snagg, Membership and Volunteer Coordinator, presented a workshop on volunteer recruitment and volunteer engagement at the Older Adult Centres Association of Ontario Eastern Region meeting
- TGC and specifically the Adult Day Program were featured on the United Way Minute on CTV and Bell media outlets
- TGC has a new partnership with Somerset West Community Health Centre to provide health services for members. Both a Nurse and a Nurse Practitioner are on-site on a regular basis.
- TGC is building on its transportation program to serve additional Mandarin and Cantonese speaking seniors

3. Increase and diversify funding

- Leverage to the fullest extent possible opportunities presented by current and new funders, new and existing partners and influencers
- Identify, pursue and increase funding opportunities that will meet existing, changing and future program and community needs
- Explore and secure foundation and private donations that offer philanthropic objectives that align with our mission
- Recruit champions to support The Good Companions

- In 2019/20, The Good Companions secured a one time grant from Telus to purchase iPads and to offer classes on the use of the technology and safe use of social media sites.
- In 2019/20 TGC received funding from New Horizons and the Ottawa Community Foundation. Both grants were converted to support TGC's COVID-19 response.
- The Good Companions also received one-time funding from the Champlain Local Health Integration Network and two one-time funding approvals for the Day Centre and Seniors' Centre Without Walls from the Ministry for Seniors and Accessibility.
- The 2019/20 Santa 4 Seniors Fundraiser raised funds to allow the purchase and delivery of more then 400 gifts for isolated seniors. Special thanks to our event partners: Shawn Anthony, Amy Friesen of Tea & Toast, and Bruyère Continuing Care.
- In 2019/20, The Good Companions was approved for a grant by HOPE Volleyball. The fundraiser would have taken place in July 2020. It has been postponed to 2021. The generous grant will allow TGC to upgrade its telephone system.
- The Good Companions is grateful for a generous donation from the Danbe Foundation.
- The Good Companions Christmas Bazaar drew a huge crowd again in 2019 and raised funds to support programs at the Centre and in the community.
- TGC's Race Weekend team was out in full force in May 2019. More than eighty members joined the team to walk, run and cheer us on. Huge thanks to our sponsors the Ottawa Health Group and Renos 4 Seniors.

4. Establish a healthy, flexible and engaged workforce at The Good Companions

- Implement an integrated human resource management strategy and system to ensure the capacity of the Centre can meet the changing needs of the community
- Attract/recruit the best people for our organization
- Retain, recognize and develop our people through engagement, learning and wellness programs
- Attract, engage and support volunteers. Leverage their strengths, experience and expertise
- Ensure staffing reflects the program requirements

- Darlene Powers was promoted to Director of the Day Centre
- Staff members continue to participate in Indigenous Cultural Awareness training
- TGC hosts an annual all staff training retreat to focus on bringing staff together to enhance the programs and services for our members, volunteers and clients
- Nikkie Snagg, Membership and Volunteer Coordinator, was awarded the inaugural Trailblazer award by the Older Adult Centres Association of Ontario for her support of our members
- Joan West, amazing TGC volunteer, was recognized for her 50 years of continuous volunteer work at The Good Companions
- In 2019/2020, 325 volunteers gave over 33,145 hours!

- In 2019/20 program registration and membership continued to grow. We are serving more members and our members are participating in more programming than ever before, which means we are offering the right mix of programs and services!
- The Good Companions is working in partnership with the United Way East Ontario to promote and assist seniors with the Affordability Fund
- In the winter of 2020 we were pleased to launch a Men's Shed Program in partnership with the Social Planning Council and members of the community.
- Our Open House and Wellness Fair in September 2019 was extremely successful and attracted more than 500 members of the community!
- The Good Companions held two well attended members' meetings to share updates and gather feedback from members
- On March 16th, 2020 The Good Companions closed the doors to the Centre and pivoted to deliver all of its programs virtually.
- TGC also trained and provided resources to agencies across the region to deliver Seniors' Centre Without Walls.

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
